2 - Constituency Activity

I have attended several surgeries in Holyhead including joint surgeries with Albert Owen MP. I try where possible to work closely with my two fellow councillors on the Caergybi Ward and where there is a joint interest to work with councillors from other wards, in particular Ynys Cybi.

I have attended several community meetings to address residents' concerns in relation to Housing/Planning issues and concerns about parking and potholes in roads. Where possible I have worked closely with the Highways Department to resolve them.

3 - Initiatives and Special Activities

I have attended various briefing sessions over the year, in particular in relation to the Minesto and Morlais project which will greatly enhance Ynys Môn and Ynys Cybi in the provision of well paid, skilled jobs.

I have been using my Trade Union contacts to facilitate joint working with the Wylfa Newydd project. This would have resulted in a joint visit to the Oldbury Nuclear Plant with Council officials. However, following the sad decision by Hitachi not to proceed with the project, this can still be resurrected at a later date if required.
