2 - Constituency Activity

Due to the Covid-19 pandemic and restrictions the 'normal' servicing of constituents and dealing with issues that arise has taken a dramatically different approach to dealing with problems or queries, where possible I have met constituents personally from a safe distance so that I can identify what their issues are and have mainly conducted business by email and phone as we have not physically been allowed in to the County Council offices. This has made things more difficult but it has been a steep learning curve for both office staff and councillors in identifying and supporting the needs of the community we serve.

I also combine my role as a County Councillor with that of a Holyhead town councillor.

3 - Initiatives and Special Activities

Covid-19 has restricted a lot of what we would normally be involved in as County Councillors, events that we would attend or initiatives working with community partners has taken a completely different approach. I have registered and been working within the community as a Covid-19 volunteer where possible trying to help and support people who have been isolated or need assistance.

I have also been liaising with the Llaingoch Community hall and have purchased 6 electronic tablets and further equipment to assist with setting up a Learning Centre to upskill members of the local community in their IT skills so that they are able to broaden their horizons and communicate with family and friends during lockdown. I have also raised funding to purchase a 55" inch, state of the art TV along with 6 DAB radios to donate to Ysbyty Penrhos Stanley in Holyhead for patients on the wards during the Covid crisis and beyond which I presented to the hospital before Xmas.
