## 2 - Constituency Activity

Locally the Covid situation has dominated and I tried my best to help share the messages and reassure local people to help them through this pandemic. A key feature of the communications was working with the Puffin editorial team on a special edition of the magazine which was fully bilingual and full of information to help people through Covid, this was out early in the first lockdown and as worries were at their highest. We gained funding from Medrwn Mon and were able to publish nearly 5,000 copies and set up an account with the Royal Mail to distribute.

Another key feature was in supporting the Seiriol Alliance in setting up the 'Good Turn Scheme' and the grant funding through Anglesey Council for this purpose. The good turn scheme has played a key role locally in helping the most vulnerable during Covid and beyond.

Regularly attend the community Councils, Llanddona, Cwm Cadnant, Llangoed and Penmon and the Beaumaris Town Council.

Helped many with their personal issues, around housing, social care and issues such as highways matters and environmental health.

One issue I had been pressing for a number of years on was flood protection for Llansadwrn, and was delighted when the IACC secured around £80,000 for a scheme, this work was carried out during the year and although not perfect it has no doubt improved the situation.

Following on from the flood work, I secured a donation from Griffiths the contractor to purchase a defibrillator for Llansadwrn and through working with Cwm Cadnant who have been fantastic we managed to take over the BT phone kiosk to house the unit, the community council funding and putting a lot of work in to see this though.

#### 3 - Initiatives and Special Activities

Within my Maritime portfolio role, I was delighted to secure and see over £220,000 investment in Beaumaris Pier.

As the Economy and Tourism portfolio holder the past 12 months has been like no other, firstly in closing and protecting and then in supporting and reopening safely. When measures were eased I lead on a campaign to rediscover Anglesey safely, with a public campaign on the key measures to follow to enjoy a visit in a safe and responsible way.
