Probably one of the most emotional contributions has been taking part in the Vigil event for Ukraine held in Beaumaris along with fellow members, Beaumaris Town Council and the Church in Wales.

Regularly attend the community Councils, Llanddona, Cwm Cadnant, Llangoed and Penmon and the Beaumaris Town Council.

Helped many with their personal issues, around housing, social care and issues such as highways matters and environmental health.

Part of the Castle Square committee which is the newly formed group to oversee activity within this area of Beaumaris.

Working with Menter Mon to develop better public wi-fi connection in Town centres with Beaumaris selected to be one such place, with work going ahead in the background.

When the young farmers club with the Seiriol ward found themselves needing a leader to continue I stepped up and supported the Llangoed Club, arranging a range of weekly activities for the young people and competing at the County Eisteddfod and Rally.

Delighted to support and see implanted a scheme installed at Mill Lane Beaumaris to help proted businesses and residents from flooding, this innovative sheme, the first of its kind also won a national award.

Raised concerns and pressed Welsh Gov for action along with fellow Seiriol Ward Cllrs and Senedd Member in relation to flooding at Fryars Bay.

Constant discussion with the contractor working on the 70m pipe installation work in Old Llandegfan for flood alleviation.

Supported more defibrillators within the Seiriol Ward and training opportunities for local people.

Many initiatives supported including the Plastic Free Beaumaris campaign, a dark skies initiative and re-discover Anglesey safely campaign.

A big piece of work has been leading the review of the use of the Menai Strait and working with many stakeholders to produce a code of conduct and launching via a public campaign.

As portfolio holder, led and delivered a number of brand new business units to support the Anglesey Economy.

Supported the tidal energy project of the coast of Anglesey to gain funds and project approval.
