2 - Constituency Activity

In addition to sitting on the above committees I also regularly attend a number of other meetings throughout my ward including:

Town and Community Council Meetings – I am a Town Councillor with Llangefni Town Council (I attended 9 out of 11 meetings – 83%) and I have also assumed the main responsibility amongst the three Canolbarth Môn Councillors for attending Bodffordd Community Council (I attended 10 out of 11 meetings – 91%).

On occasions I attend Gwalchmai, Bryngwran and Llanddyfnan Community Council meetings although my fellow Canolbarth Môn Councillors are the main representatives on these committees.

School Governor Meetings – I am a school governor of Canolfan Addysg y Bont and Vice-Chair of the Board of Governors for Ysgol Gymuned Bodffordd.

I am a member of the Llangefni Town Partnership and the Anglesey Rural Food Bank. I also have regular liaison meetings with senior representatives of Môn Communities First. Last year I was also appointed to serve on the North Wales Community Health Council which is one of eight statutory NHS Wales watchdogs representing public and patient interests in healthcare. Recently the C.H.C. has been publicly critical over the lack of consultation undertaken by the Betsi Cadwaladr Health Board in announcing its decision to temporarily suspend obstetric services at Ysbyty Glan Clwyd. Consequently I attended as an observer at the public meeting held at St Asaph Cathedral on the 12th. March to discuss these contentious proposals.

As well as attending various meetings I also have a significant caseload as I seek to undertake work on behalf of my constituents. Examples of cases I have dealt with over the last twelve months include:

- Planning objections to applications.
- Housing advice and assistance re allocations policy.
- Neighbour disputes.
- Leisure concerns over the threat to Llangefni Golf Course and the squash courts at Plas Arthur.
- Property complaints regarding hazards caused by disused properties.
- Highways complaints/concerns relating to parking, potholes, speeding.
- Social Services emergency access difficulties for residents in sheltered accommodation.

In order to make myself as accessible as possible to my constituents I have created my own Councillor Dylan Rees Facebook page. Together with my two fellow Canolbarth Môn Councillors I have also started holding advice surgeries in Llangefni.

3 - Initiatives and Special Activities

My overall aim as a Councillor is to try and make a real difference in the lives of the people I have been elected to serve. I am currently involved in two local initiatives which I hope will bring about lasting benefit to the community:

• I have recently been appointed Chair of the Anglesey Skate Park Project Group. The Group has been established for the purpose of delivering a new skate park facility in Llangefni following the demolition of the old skate park. This is a long-term project which if successful will greatly benefit local youngsters. • I am a member of the newly formed committee for "Parc Plant Gwalchmai". The park is in urgent need of funding and was in danger of having to close. Amongst many fund raising activities that are taking place I will be participating in the Menter Môn Walkathon on the 24 May 2015 which is a sponsored walk over a distance of 26.2miles.
