4. Response to Consultation and Publicity

Public Consultation – The application was afforded two means of publicity. These were by the posting of a site notice near the site and publication of a notice in the local press. The latest date for the receipt of representations was the 15th August 2013. At the time of writing this report no representations had been received at the department.

16C119A - Alterations and extensions to Pen yr Orsedd, Engedi – Approved 28/09/1998 **6. Main Planning Considerations**

Principle of Development – The proposal entails the erection of workshop and office (measuring 10.6m (length) x 10.6m (width) x 4.2m (ridge height)) which is located within the countryside on the outskirts of Engedi. The proposal is outside the development boundary of the settlements referred to in the Ynys Môn Local Plan and the Stopped Unitary Development Plan and is not allocated for any specific uses. National and local policies seek to discourage economic development (other than agricultural or farm diversification) on sites in the open countryside. Where possible employment sites should be located within or adjacent to existing settlements. New building in the open countryside away from existing settlements or areas allocated for development in development plans must continue to be strictly controlled.

Policy 2 of the Ynys Môn Local Plan states that on sites outside existing settlements, the Council will permit employment developments only in exceptional circumstances where the applicant has been able to demonstrate specific locational requirements and economic benefits which would justify allowing the proposal.

The information provided indicates that the proposed workshop would be used partly for purposes incidental to the enjoyment of the dwellinghouse, and partly in connection with the applicant's joinery business. The applicant has stated that the proposal is the only viable and sustainable option for his personal circumstances, as he cannot afford to buy a commercial site or rent an industrial unit. However, the authority does not consider that this would justify allowing the proposal in this location.

Highway Safety – The road network leading to the site from the main highway is substandard in terms of its width and there are insufficient passing areas with restricted forward visibility. The Highway Authority have recommended that there should not be an increase in traffic to the site other than the applicant entering and exiting the site for the purpose of his business. However, it is not considered that this can be controlled.

7. Conclusion

Having considered the above and all other material consideration my recommendation is one of refusal.

8. Recommendation

Refusal

(01) The applicant had not demonstrated that there are exceptional circumstances including specific locational requirements and economic benefits to justify allowing the proposal. The proposal is therefore contrary to Policy 2 of the Ynys Môn Local Plan.
