### 1 CHAIRPERSON

Mr T.Victor Hughes was elected Chairperson of the Isle of Anglesey Charitable Trust Committee.

#### 2 VICE-CHAIRPERSON

Mr Aled Morris Jones was elected Vice-Chairperson of the Isle of Anglesey Charitable Trust Committee.

#### **3 DECLARATION OF INTEREST**

Mrs Llinos Huws declared a personal and prejudicial interest in respect of item 7 on the agenda and she withdrew from the meeting during the discussion and determination of this matter. She also declared a personal but not prejudicial interest in respect of item 8 on the basis of her children's membership of the Urdd organisation.

Mrs Nicola Roberts declared a personal but not prejudicial interest in respect of item 8 on the agenda on account of her own former membership and her children's current membership of the Urdd organisation and she said that she would be keeping an open mind on the matter.

Mr Carwyn Jones declared a personal but not prejudicial interest in respect of items 7 and 8 on the agenda as a former member of the Anglesey Young Farmers Movement and on account of his children's membership of the Urdd organisation but said that he would approach both matters with an open mind.

Mr Aled Morris Jones declared a personal but not prejudicial interest in respect of item 7 on the agenda on the basis of his former membership and his daughter's current membership of the Rhosybol Young Farmers' Club and he said that he would be keeping an open mind on the matter.

Mr W.T.Hughes also declared a personal but not prejudicial interest in respect of item 7 on the agenda as a former member of the Rhosybol Young Farmers' Club and he said that he too would be keeping an open mind on the matter.

Mr R.P.Jones declared a personal and prejudicial interest in respect of item 7 on the agenda due to the fact that the Chair of the Anglesey Young Farmers' Movement is a close relative and he withdrew from the meeting during the discussion and determination of this matter. He also declared a non prejudicial interest in respect of item 8 on the agenda as a contributor to the Urdd organisation.

### 4 MINUTES 22 APRIL, 2014 MEETING

The minutes of the previous meeting of the Isle of Anglesey Charitable Trust Committee were presented and confirmed as correct.

### **5 INVESTMENT AND CONTRACTS COMMITTEE**

The minutes of the meeting of the Investment and Contracts Committee held on 20<sup>th</sup> May, 2014 were confirmed and adopted where necessary.

### 6 PROVISIONAL OUT-TURN 2013/14 AND BUDGET 2014/15

A report setting out the provisional out-turn for 2013/14 along with recommended funding allocations for 2014/5 was presented for the Trustees' consideration.

The Acting Accountancy Services Manager reported that the projected out-turn as updated and summarised in the table at 2.5 of the report shows that as at 31 March, 2014 the Trust's revenue reserves stand at £210k in surplus from which position the 2014/15 and 2015/16 out-turns can be projected based upon an estimated 3% growth on the income invested. Consequently it is envisaged that £471k will be available for spending in 2014/15 and £484k in 2015/16.

The budget for 3014/15 as reflected in the written report proposes the following -

 200K allocation to Oriel Ynys Môn in line with the reduced funding strategy for the Oriel adopted as part of the 2013/14 budget setting process.

The Acting Accountancy Services Manager said that following discussions with Mr Hywel Eifion Jones and in light of the financial position of the Oriel it is recommended that the allocation be adjusted upwards to £215k or £220k.

• £66k allocation to village halls.

The Acting Accountancy Services Manager said that following discussions it is recommended that this be adjusted upwards to £80k

• £50k allocation to community facilities and for minor grants

The Acting Accountancy Services Manager said that following discussions it is recommended that the £50k allocation be retained but that the level of each individual grant be adjusted upwards from £6k to £10k per annum.

The Secretary said that the decision to adopt a strategy of reduced funding for Oriel Ynys Môn was taken in part to create a clear distinction between a Council provision and the responsibilities of the Trust as a charitable entity. Oriel Ynys Môn is at present experiencing some difficulties in meeting its income targets and is at risk of overspending. Mr Hywel Eifion Jones is proposing deviating from the strategy for this year to allow for an increased allocation to be made to the Oriel. However, the Trust must come to a decision on the level of funding to the Oriel independently of the Council's perspective.

With regard to the proposed allocation for community facilities and minor grants the Secretary informed the Trustees that the total sum of all the applications received by the 9<sup>th</sup> May deadline (before they have been sifted for compliance with the Trust's funding criteria) is estimated to be £137k which is far in excess of the £50k recommended budget to be delegated to the General Grants Committee for this purpose. In addition, other applications for funding have been received or are in the offing including applications from the Anglesey Young Farmers' Movement and Urdd Gobaith Cymru which are under consideration at today's meeting. However spending outside the budget parameters means making use of the Trust's capital of £18m which the trustees can do if they so wish. As trustees, Members need to bear in mind also that the value of the fund can decrease as well as increase depending on the market's performance.

Members of the Trust considered the information presented and indicated that they were minded to increase the budget allocation for community facilities in recognition of the community need for funding and because the articles state that "the Trustees may at any time or times at their discretion pay or apply the whole or any part or parts of the capital of the Trust fund in promotion of the charitable purposes in such manner as the Trustees think fit." It was also pointed out that after the sifting process has taken place the value of the applications received may well decrease as those that do not meet the funding criteria are disregarded.

Mr Kenneth Hughes wished it be noted that having regard to the regulations governing the Trust and notwithstanding his support for Oriel Ynys Môn, he was uncomfortable with utilising the Trust's funds to support the Oriel as he believed that this was contrary to the regulations.

Mr Alun Mummery proposed that the General Grants Committee be authorised to approve all the grant applications that comply with the Trust's funding criteria making it clear that that this would be without prejudice to any future determinations and that part of the trust's capital fund be utilised to this end should that be necessary. His proposal was seconded by Mr Lewis Davies.

The Interim Head of Function (Resources) & Section 151 Officer advised that good financial management means setting a budget and then endeavouring to adhere to it. If the General Grants Committee is unable to comply with the budget allocated then it should report on the situation to the Trust and seek approval for any additional spend. If Members of the Trust are minded to approve the applications received in their totality, then he suggested that consideration be given to adjusting the 2014/15 budget to £137k to enable the General Grants Committee to accommodate all the requests if it so chooses. As regards setting a precedent for future years, despite the inclusion of a proviso, such a step does set a precedent.

Mr Aled Morris Jones proposed an amendment that the allocation for community facilities and minor grants be increased to £100k only for 2014/15 on the basis that the position of the Trust fund is healthy at this point in time and allows for the increase to be made. His proposal was seconded by Mr W.T.Hughes. Following a vote on the matter the original proposal made by Mr Alun Mummery was carried.

In relation to Oriel Ynys Môn, the majority of the Trust's members were in agreement that the allocation should be increased to £215k in 2014/15 on account of the difficulties which the Oriel is experiencing in fulfilling income targets, but they emphasised that further consideration should be given to the Oriel Ynys Môn funding arrangement with a view to resolving the issues arising and to reverting next year to the reduced funding strategy.

#### Following a full discussion it was resolved -

- To adopt a budget for 2014/15 as follows:
  - Oriel Ynys Môn £215k (Mr Kenneth Hughes voted against this proposal for the reason given)
  - Village Halls £80k
  - Community Facilities and Minor grants see below
- With regard to community facilities and minor grants, to authorise the General Grants Committee to approve all those applications received by the deadline that comply with the Trust's funding criteria without prejudice to any determinations in future years and that part of the capital fund be utilised for this purpose should that be necessary.
- To return to the financial strategy and Oriel Ynys Môn funding arrangement at a later date in the year.

### 7 TRUST APPLICATION – THE ISLE OF ANGLESEY YOUNG FARMERS' MOVEMENT

An application for funding by the Isle of Anglesey Young Farmers' Movement was presented for the Trust's consideration. The application requested an annual contribution of £30,000 over the next 5 years to fund part of the running costs of the Federation over that time as well as to promote its programme of cultural and social activities. The application was supported by documentation which set out the Federation's activities on Anglesey 2013/14 and how these contribute to the personal development of its members, as well as enriching the life of local communities on the Island; the movement's promotion of bilingualism; its financial position and how it endeavours to provide value for money.

Sian Pierce Roberts, County Chair of the Anglesey Young Farmers' Movement, Gerallt Hughes, County Chair of Training and Ann Postle, County Organiser gave a visual presentation and addressed the Trust on the application and what the funding would be used for, as well as the benefits they had personally derived from being members of the Anglesey Young Farmers' Movement.

Members of the Trust were given the opportunity to ask questions of the Movement's representatives.

It was resolved unanimously to approve the funding application made by the Anglesey Young Farmers' Movement for £30k per annum for a period of 5 years.

### 8 TRUST APPLICATION – URDD GOBAITH CYMRU

An application for funding by Urdd Gobaith Cymru was presented for the Trust's consideration. The application requested an annual contribution of £40,000 to develop first class services for the children and young people of Anglesey over the next 5 years to enable the organisation's members to access more of its services daily and to expand the Urdd's work to communities on the Island that might not have had the full service in the past. The application was supported by documentation which described the services which the Urdd can offer; its Business Plan and objectives along with its activities on Anglesey via various forums, committees, aelwydau, eisteddfodau and other channels.

Eryl Williams, Anglesey Development Officer, Manon Rowlands, Mari Evans, lestyn Wyn Lewis and Carwyn Jones, Anglesey Regional Members gave a visual presentation and addressed the Trust on the application, what the funding would be used for, and their own experiences as members of the Urdd on Anglesey.

Members of the Trust were given the opportunity to ask questions of the organisation's representatives.

It was resolved unanimously to approve the funding application made by Urdd Gobaith Cymru for £40k per annum for a period of 5 years.

### 9 ITEM TAKEN IN PRIVATE – RHOSGOCH LAND

### **3 DECLARATION OF INTEREST**

Mr. Lewis Davies declared an interest in respect of application 29 – Community Centre, Llanfaes and application 45 – Llangoed Playing Field. Mr. Davies left the meeting during discussion and voting thereon.

Mr. Peter S. Rogers declared an interest in respect of application 18 – Pritchard Jones Institute Ltd., application 20 – Malltraeth Ymlaen Ltd., and application 40 – Parc y Bont School – Partents Teachers Association. Mr. Rogers remained in the meeting but took no part in discussion and voting thereon.

### 4 ANNUAL GRANTS 2013/14

Submitted – report on behalf of the Treasurer in relation to the above.

It was reported that the purpose of the report was to consider applications relevant to the Isle of Anglesey Charitable Trust. Allocations are made annually from the Isle of Anglesey Charitable Trust to the following categories of projects :-

- Community and Sporting Facilities (small capital projects)
- Other Grants (mainly one-off small grants)

At its meeting on 24 April, 2014 the full Charitable Trust resolved to authorise this Committee to approve all those applications received by the deadline that comply with the Trust's funding criteria without prejudice to any determinations in future years and that part of the capital fund be utilised for this purpose should that be necessary. The Secretary stated that 5 applications had been received after the closing date for grant application. Members of the Committee considered that these applications should not be considered.

The relevant Officers from the departments involved have considered and prioritised the applications received as far as possible and consistent with the Trust's decisions, criteria established in previous years and within the amount of funding available for allocation. The Officer's recommendations were shown in Appendices A and B attached to the report. A joint referencing system has been employed for both grants put forward to this Committee and for grant applications to the Welsh Church Fund; any gaps in the reference numbers will be due to those grants having been put forward to the Welsh Church Fund rather than the Trust. It was noted that the applications are considered in accordance with the 'Criteria for the Allocation of Grants from the Charitable Trust', a copy of which was attached as Appendix C to the report.

### **1.0 INTRODUCTION**

This report has been prepared for the Isle of Anglesey Charitable Trust with a view to submitting an application for capital funding to further enhance CCTV systems in the 5 towns. For the purposes of this project the 5 town councils on the Isle of Anglesey are working in partnership and collaborating to further essential CCTV schemes to help tackle crime and disorder and to improve community safety from 2014 - 2024

### 2.0 BACKGOUND / HISTORY

2.1 The current CCTV schemes was put in place as a result of Home Office crime and Disorder funding in 2002 and have since been maintained and developed by the County Council up to June 2014. Since then and after a round of public consultation linked to austerity measures and savings plans, it has become uneconomical for the County Council to continue to host CCTV in its current form. Since this measure was approved by the Council's Executive Committee the 5 Town Council's from Holyhead, Llangefni, Amlwch, Menai Bridge and Beaumaris have prepared and signed a handover agreement to maintain and run current systems until the end of September 2014.

2.2 Following an initial approach to the Isle of Anglesey trust, permission was given by the County Council to extend the current agreement until such time that an application could be presented to the Isle of Anglesey Charitable Trust for a capital upgrade for the now ageing CCTV hardware.

2.3 The current scheme when installed was the first digitally recorded scheme in Wales, and has proved invaluable in reducing crime overall by 40% on the Isle of Anglesey over the last decade. The Community Safety Partnership considers that CCTV has been instrumental in making the streets of Anglesey safer and that the loss of such a scheme would be very detrimental to businesses, the general public, visitors, the environment, future inward investment, jobs and economic growth.

### **3.0 CURRENT SITUATION**

3.1 The 5 town councils have since come together as one body to discuss how best to progress the continuation and enhancement of the old scheme. A detailed survey of all existing cameras was undertaken to ascertain a number of factors:

- 1. Camera integrity
- 2. Maintenance Issues
- 3. Fibre optic Links
- 4. Recording hardware
- 5. Coverage areas
- 6. Accessibility to evidence
- 7. Future proofing the technology

3.2 Advice was taken from the engineer who originally designed and built the scheme and technical input and support was made availability to that committee for a 3 month duration by the County Council.

3.3 It is desirable from a commissioning perspective to have one technical specification and consistent technology for all the 5 towns.

3.4 The Police's perspective is that all recorded evidence must be accessible to them and should be forthcoming and compatible in a manner which can be utilised by the courts for evidential purposes.

3.5 The prices and quotations for the various schemes in each town have been obtained

### 4.0 SCHEME ADVANTAGES

4.1 The mutual benefit to all parties is that maintaining a CCTV system will continue to reduce the cost of crime to residents, visitors and businesses. CCTV needs to be viewed as a system that will ultimately reduce anti-social behaviour, cut down the number of burglaries and shoplifting events and help tackle violent crime not to mention substance misuse and the negative impact of excessive alcohol consumption on towns and communities

4.2 CCTV within town centres gives members of the public the reassurance that they can go about their daily business with confidence, it gives members of the business community added security and sends a clear message to those engaged in crime or anti-social behaviour that they will be caught and will be prosecuted.

4.3 CCTV is designed to assist in prevention and detection of crime and create safer communities through:

- Providing evidence to relevant enforcement agencies
- maintaining public order
- preventing anti-social behaviour and nuisance
- providing reassurance
- supporting the Anglesey 3 towns regeneration programme

### **5.0 PUBLIC SUPPORT**

5.1 During July and August 2014 a public survey was undertaken with residents and visitors across Anglesey to ascertain their thoughts and feelings towards the future of CCTV. 96% of respondents agreed to maintain a CCTV service with an additional 80% supportive of seeking financial assistance from the Isle of Anglesey Charitable Trust.

5.2 Two points which relate to public safety and reassurance were:

- In response to the question 'Where do you feel most unsafe?' 75% of respondents stated 'on the street'.
- In response to the question 'Are you more concerned about safety at certain times of the day?' 70% of respondents stated during the evening and at night.

5.3 A further breakdown showing the responses to this public consultation can be found in **appendix 1** attached.

5.4 Since August public opinion has continued to be sought through petitions across each of the 5 main towns on Anglesey.

### **6.0 SCHEME RESPONSIBILITY**

6.1 If successful the 5 town councils have indicated a firm commitment to adopt and manage the scheme for the next 10 years with a view to having further discussions with large scale developers about their contribution towards improving public safety on the Isle of Anglesey.

6.2 Naturally it would be up to each town council to take responsibility for their own scheme in terms of the initial design, planning, procurement, wayleaves, maintenance and monitoring/access requirements.

6.3 North Wales Police and Community Safety Partners will continue to work closely with each town council under the auspices of the Crime and Disorder Act 1998.

6.4 An agreement between the 5 town councils and the Police will be drawn up to ensure that each scheme maintains a code of conduct and standards of recording pertinent to evidence collection. This is in line with the Office of Surveillance Good Practise and the Data Protection Act.

6.5 The 5 town councils have obtained quotations designed to maintain their cctv systems at a cost of £20,000 per year over a committed 10 year period (£200,000)

6.6 Discussions are taking place within the 5 town councils as to the management of the scheme whether that is under the present structure or through a limited company by guarantee.

### 7.0 FINANCIAL ASPECTS

7.1 All hardware purchased would be the responsibility of each respective town council. This will include insurance provision for actual hardware, public liability, etc... The total sum applied for from the trust will be apportioned in accordance with the quotations received by each town council.

7.2 It must be borne in mind that each of the town councils respectively are also willing to invest their own funds into the new scheme, and North Wales Police as a cornerstone partner have also pledged financial contribution should the charitable trust see their way clear to supporting this application.

7.3 Any contingencies will be borne by the town councils.

### **8.0 RECOMMENDATION**

### The Isle of Anglesey Charitable trust is therefore requested to consider the sum of £195,000.

This sum if approved will enable the 5 main towns on Anglesey to be equipped with 21<sup>st</sup> century technology which will include 360 degree high definition cameras with a significant improvement in evidential quality over the existing scheme. It will further assist the Police and other partners to accede to their duties in reducing crime and disorder and improving community safety at a time when there are plans for significant economic development with projects planned which will exceed £25 billion in total
