A –Recommendation/s and reason/s

To change the reference in paragraph 4.6.21.6 of the Constitution from 3 minutes to 5 minutes (that is the time that members of the public are allowed to speak in the Planning Committee).

Recommendations:

- 1. That the Executive recommends that the Council makes the change to 5 minutes. It is a requirement that a change to the Constitution is considered by the Executive first (paragraph 2.15.2.1 of the Constitution);
- 2. That the Council approves the change to 5 minutes and delegates:
 - a. To the Monitoring Officer the right to make the change to the Constitution, and:
 - b. To the Head of Regulation the right to change any reference in guidance related to the procedure that members of the public are allowed to speak for 5 minutes.

B – What other options did you consider and why did you reject them and/or opt for this option?

The procedure for allowing members of the public to speak in the Planning Committee has been operational for a number of years. Since its inception the time allowed for public speaking at the Committee has been 3 minutes.

Recently there have been requests through the Committee to ask if the time allowed can be extended. A proposal to extend the allotted time to 5 minutes has been supported by the Political Group Leaders. B – What other options did you consider and why did you reject them and/or opt for this option?

The proposal to extend the time has been subject to consultation with the Planning Committee. Their response will be reported to full Council.

Increasing the time allowed for members of the public to speak to 5 minutes will ensure consistency with the time allowed for elected members to speak in the Committee – including local members when discussing relevant applications (paragraph 4.1.15.4 of the Constitution as it is relevant to the Planning Committee through paragraph 4.1.28).

It is a requirement that a change to the Constitution is firstly considered by the Executive (paragraph 2.15.2.1 of the Constitution).
